ADVOCACY

UNITED NATIONS:

A story with no (happy) end, a story that needs to be told...

Persons in this drama: Peter, my good friend and mate (NOT Peter, my husband!) Beatrice, his wife Christine and Claudia, their daughters Ursula, Beatrice's old friend and school mate Sabine, Ursula's daughter and Peter's goddaughter

Switzerland, 35 years ago: Peter was my friend and best mate. We worked together, we saw each other socially, I knew his wife Beatrice quite well; Peter and I organised school camps together. We were often taken as brother and sister, me being the older sister. I trusted and liked Peter and lot and respected his intelligence and extrovert nature. His 2 daughters and son were still babies and toddlers.

Australia, 4 years ago.: Peter emailed me that his daughter Christine, now 30 years old, wanted to visit and stay awhile. He indicated that she was mentally fragile as she just ended a troublesome relationship. Christine arrived and from the start Peter (my Peter this time!) realised that this was a very troubled young lady. She misbehaved like a teenager, had terrible mood swings and at times abused us verbally. It was just after the International Women's Day, when I had my presentation, that I finally got her to talk. IT WASN'TTHE RELATIONSHIP THAT WASTHE PROBLEM, BUT HER FATHER! From the age of 5 Christine was sexually abused by her father. When she went to tell her mother, the way a 5 year old would, she was told by her mother that she was a liar! Where does a 5 year old girl turn to, if her mother doesn't believe her? So the abuse continued and Christine never told anybody, until she caught her father trying to abuse his then 2 year old granddaughter by Christine's sister Claudia. The past came rushing back, Christine again confronted her father and mother and told her sister about the incident. Their reaction? Claudia made sure that her daughter was never again alone with her grandfather, Beatrice was still in denial and so was Peter, the abuser.

Switzerland, 3½ years ago: As always during my visit to Switzerland I caught up with Ursula, a friend of many years and a very good friend of Beatrice. I told her about Christine, because I couldn't just forget what she told me! JUST A MONTH PRIOR TO OUR MEETING HER DAUGHTER SABINE, 36 YEARS OLD, TOLD HER MOTHER THAT SHE HAD BEEN RAPED BY PETER, HER GODFATHER! Ursula was devastated. She knew that her daughter Sabine had been sexually molested, but Sabine never told her by whom. She told her mum that the incident felt like a pussy boil that couldn't be touched. Once open, there was no way of knowing what would happen... But after my story Ursula and I realised that our good friend Peter was not only a paedophile, but probably had destroyed the lives of more young girls than we initially thought. After a short investigation we found 5 young women who had been abused by Peter when they were children and staying with Peter and Beatrice. They were all good friends of the family and nobody suspected anything. Ursula and I had to go to the police, which we did the next morning.

Police investigation in Switzerland: except the attempted abuse of Peter's granddaughter, all other abuses couldn't be pursued by the police as the period of limitation had expired! (They have changed the law since, but the new laws — no limitation on child sex offenses — were not retrospective.) The police did interview Peter, but of course he denied everything. Claudia, his daughter, didn't want to testify against her father and Christine was too troubled to be a reliable witness. Peter is an important member of his community; he is a lawyer, sits on numerous committees and had a very high job in an insurance company. So the whole thing blew over. Ursula and I were left angry and frustrated. Ursula was worried about her daughter and very angry that her ex-friend Beatrice had never spoken out all these years. We knew that Beatrice was aware of what was going on, but stuck her head in the sand!!

Last week in Switzerland: interview of Sabine in the biggest women's weekly in Switzerland. The interview was supposed to be about her newest film to be released in March 2015, but the interview took an unexpected turn: Sabine started to talk about her abuse. Here is a translation of some of her words, basically the beginning of her interview: "I don't know if what I am going to say is what you want to hear, but I am going to say it anyway. You can decide whether you want to publish it or not: at 5 years of age I was sexually abused (by her godfather) and the man filmed the incident. I repressed this memory for years and took refuge in dance. My parents thought: our daughter is a bit special, an artistic type... I never told them anything, because I wasn't quite sure whether it was only in my head or real. When I was 19 I did my first film. In one segment I played a young woman who was physically harassed – in front of the film cameras, just like it happened when I was five years old! Everything came flooding back: the abuse, the filming. Only now could I tell my mum, but not who he was." She goes on that this abuse and her way of dealing with it, was probably one of the reasons she became a dancer and then an actress. The abuse never leaves her, but it is part of her life. She made her trauma her gift of acting, identifying herself with the roles she plays. At the beginning it was the valve she needed to get rid of the hate she felt against her abuser. For her, acting is better than psychoanalysis.

I had to share this story with you all. There is a young woman who used her pain to become a great actress. But it took her 35 years to publically tell the story! The only satisfaction I have is that a lot of people in Switzerland will know what happened and a lot will put two and two together. Peter, now in his sixties, won't get away with it anymore. I'll always be angry that he never got punished, that his wife didn't stand up for these kids who trusted him and her, that I misjudged a person so utterly and completely! He left a trail of damaged women on the way, one being his daughter Christine.

Birthing Kits & Training in Tamil Nadu



When Dalit (untouchable) women in the southern Indian state of Tamil Nadu give birth they must select one of two risky choices. They can either have their baby at home or go to a government hospital. At home this will probably mean giving birth on a dirt floor in a dwelling with no running water. The trip to hospital is little safer. Under supply or corruption have left the hospitals with huge infection risks in the form of dirty mattresses, unclean scalpels, no gloves, soap or clean ties.

The Birthing Kit Foundation of Australia (BKFA) supplies birthing kits to and has educated over 1,000 traditional birth attendants in Tamil Nadu. Each one now takes a kit along for every birth she attends, whether it is for use at home or as a back-up when she accompanies a mother in a government facility. A traditional birth attendant armed with a birthing kit can be a life saver wherever a birth takes place.

Education programs in Tamil Nadu, funded by the Birthing Kit Foundation (Australia), make sure more than just the traditional birth attendants get the message. Husbands and caretakers get involved and find out how they can play a part in a clean, safe birth or act as a back-up if a woman does need hospital support. Adolescent girls are also being educated on the health challenges they face when they become mothers. For the first time whole communities in this state now understand the importance of a clean, safe and healthy birthing environment.
