District & Zonta International Membership News

Are you registered for the membership workshop at Conference? The workshop- will be led by Belinda Moore from Strategic Membership Solutions (SMS) and include a panel of Zontians from each of our four Districts.

Membership statistics as at 30 April 2019 as provided by our Lieutenant Governor are:

Zonta International – 28,499 members, Young Professionals 318 - 11 of the total of 38 Australia-wide are in D22. At international level 13 new Clubs have been chartered with a further 14 in formation and 28 persons have Individual Membership with 2 in Queensland.

Membership for D22 as at 30 April 2019 is 952 and we have a target of 1010 by the end of this biennium ie 31 May 2020. New members are each receiving a 100 Year Centennial Membership Certificate and a 100 Year Pin. Those Zontians who did not renew for 2019-2020 are each being invited to consider Individual Membership and an Exit Survey is being undertaken.

Kerstin migrated from Germany to Australia in 1991, completed her Bachelor of Arts and Diploma of Education at the University of Queensland (UQ) and commenced an over 20 years teaching career in German and English language teaching in primary, secondary and tertiary education settings. Kerstin has been involved with community work in Australia and in India. Kerstin was involved in setting up a school for disadvantaged children in India and is the chairperson for a small NGO (Bodhgaya Development Association) supporting literacy, health and empowerment projects in Bihar state, India. She is actively supporting a number of women's empowerment projects in India and sees education as the main vehicle for transformation and empowerment. She instigated a sister school agreement with a

high school in Darmstadt, Germany and led an exchange program that brought German and Australian student and parent communities together. Her passion for intercultural understanding, networking and community prompted her to study and complete a degree in the Masters of Community Development Practice program. She has been involved in developing and publishing curriculum resources and audio support materials for teachers for the Australian Curriculum, German. She is also a member of professional associations such as the Modern Language Teachers Association, the 'German Round Table' networking group and has most recently been working as a German bi-lingual language facilitator for the <u>Speak My Language</u> (National Aged Care Podcasting and Radio Program). Kerstin has been a member of Zonta Brisbane East Club since 2013 and has been an executive member for three years.
