Amelia Earhart Fellowship Program

A Zonta International program, funded by the Zonta International Foundation

The Zonta International Amelia Earhart Fellowships were established in 1938 in honour of Amelia Earhart, famed pilot and member of The Zonta Clubs of Boston and New York. The Fellowships are made annually to women pursuing graduate PhD/doctoral degrees in aerospace-related sciences and engineering.



Since 1938 Zonta has awarded 1,192 Amelia Earhart Fellowships totalling US\$7 million to women pursuing PhD degrees in aerospace science and engineering - women following Amelia's dream for gender equality.

(Of the twelve 2007 Fellowships, none was awarded to any Australian women however XIA LI is studying at Monash University)

XIA LI

- Citizenship: P.R. China
- Proposed Program: Electrical Engineering at Monash University

Ms. Li will use her Fellowship to study a new technique in communications. Optical Orthogonal Frequency Division Multiplexing (OOFDM) uses optical rather than radio frequencies and therefore will not interfere with electronic equipment and will have many applications in airplanes and spacecraft. Her advisor was one of the inventors of this technology just one year ago; its many applications are just being explored. This new technique will allow very high data rates and may be used, for example, to distribute internet to travelers using laptops during flights. Ms. Li also works with a group that introduces new technology and inventions to teenage girls to interest them in careers in engineering.

Zonta International Resolution on Violence Against Women (VAW)

Zonta International Strategies To Eradicate Violence Against Women And Children (ZISVAW)

For 50 years Zonta International, in partnership with the United Nations, has focused on recognizing women's rights. Zonta International held a summit to determine the causes, costs and consequences of, and possible solutions to, issues surrounding violence against women.

WHEREAS: Zonta International worldwide has selected the eradication of violence against women of all generations as a service focus locally and internationally

Be it resolved therefore that:

- 1. Zonta International, utilizing its membership and drawing upon diverse international expertise and resources, will develop strategies to eradicate violence against women.
- 2. Zontians in their clubs will select issues of concern and generate a plan of action for their summit meetings.
- 3. Zonta International regional summit meetings will include all concerned members of the community, government agencies, organizations and associations, recognizing that violence against women is an issue that affects mankind.
- 4. Zonta International will develop an International Resource Centre and Advisory Council to enhance the capacity to monitor legislation and advocate for the elevation of women's social status, guaranteeing their rights as human rights.
- 5. Zonta International will promote education regarding women's rights, to create an environment of gender equality in family life, in the sphere of education, in the work place, and in government.
- 6. Zonta International will increase efforts to provide social, emotional, financial, health and environmental well-being and security for the empowerment of women of all generations through advocacy within the legal, medical, and public safety systems.
