

ROSALIE WELBURN—PROFILE.

Born in Rockhampton, the only child of Beryl Pattison (nee Wakefield of Emu Park) and Robert Pattison (who was awarded a Brother of the Order of St John for service to the St John's Ambulance Brigade), I attended Frenchville State School and then North Rockhampton High.

After marriage and children (two sons, and now two grandchildren) I completed the STEPS course at Central Qld University and went on to obtain a Diploma of Teaching. Further study saw me obtain a Bachelor of Education and a Masters of Education in School Management.

For over twenty years, I have worked in a variety of schools, both country and city, large and small. I commenced my Principalship at a small 1-teacher school at St Lawrence. I am currently the Principal at Stanwell State School but have Acted as Principal and Deputy at a number of schools in the Rockhampton region. In the 2003-2004 USA school year, I taught at LaFayette Elementary school in North Carolina. I was awarded the International Teacher of the Year for the County. I am very fortunate that a great many of the students, and parents of students, whom I have taught, keep in touch.

My parents undertook many volunteering positions within the community and it is from them, I learnt the value of giving back to society. I enjoy Zonta as it aims to improve the lives of women both locally and internationally.

Did you know that—

During the **1930s**, **Zonta International** grew to 130 clubs in six countries spanning three continents and continued its push for gender equity in employment.

After the United States passed the "Married Persons Law," which predominantly affected wives by prohibiting more than one family member from working for the government, Zonta adopted a resolution to demand repeal of the law; and, in 1944, delegates to the Zonta International Convention endorsed the elimination of gender discrimination in job opportunities and rates of pay.

The organization also expressed support for women's reserves to the military service.


Did you know that -

In **1923**, Zonta supported relief efforts to care for 115,000 orphan children in Smyrna, Turkey, an event that marked the beginning of Zonta's dedication to helping women internationally.

As technology made the world a smaller place and Zonta clubs sprang up around the globe, international service projects, initially dedicated to world peace and women's role in attaining it, increased.

Action for World Peace expressed support for the fledgling United Nations (UN) and was adopted at the **1946** Convention.
