International Women's Day. <u>A Short History.</u>

The mother of International Women's Day was German socialist Clara Zetkin.

In **1907 she had organised an International Conference** of Socialist Women and called for all socialist parties to fight energetically for women's suffrage. The conference participants discussed demonstrating to publicize their support for women's suffrage.

In **1908** Branch Number 3 of the New York City Social Democratic Women's Society took up the call by **organising a mass meeting on women's suffrage on 8 March**.

In **1910**, at the Second International Conference of Socialist Women in Copenhagen, Zetkin proposed that there be an International Woman's Day and this was celebrated by European socialists for **the first time on 19 March 1911**.

The first Australian IWD rally took place on 25 March 1928 in the Sydney Domain, organized by the Militant Women's Movement of the Communist Party of Australia.

From **1931** IWD marches were held in Sydney and Melbourne. In the **1970s** the big street marches of women's liberation arrived and new open-ended collectives took over IWD, displacing the hat and glove brigade.

Today IWD is characterized by a mixture of celebration and stocktaking. There is an increasing emphasis on breakfasts - reflecting the tight schedules of many of those participating, particularly those with money to donate to aid projects for women. It has certainly come a long way from its origins which is no reason to mystify them.

The **colours white, purple/violet and green** are often used in relation to International Women's Day (the suffrage colours).

A few different explanations for the meaning of the colours exist:

White: purity or women Green: hope or growth or go/give Purple: courage Violet: voting, vote

When looking at the last meaning of each colour, one can see other meanings:

Women Go Voting or Give Women the Vote.
