

To assist with this fundraiser the committee requests that all Zontians and their friends delve into their wardrobes and have a spring clean.




To stock the "2nd time around shop" the committee is asking you to donate all those

MINUTES SECRETARY—PAULINE FORSTER PROFILE.

I was born in Perth, WA, and commenced primary school in East Fremantle. When I was eight years old my father decided to further his career in the Public Service and he transferred with the Customs Department to Canberra. Canberra was a fledgling city when we moved there in 1958 and throughout my childhood I watched it grow into the beautiful city it is today. I have one sister who still lives there.

I finished my schooling in Canberra, and after twelve months training on a Commonwealth Scholarship I commenced work in the Department

of Defence. I found this to be rather daunting as Australia at the time was involved in two wars, the Vietnam War and the Cold War. Security was very tight around the building with Federal Police stationed on each entrance and within the building we all had very restricted access as to where we went. We were even prevented from attending parties at the Russian Embassy.

I then worked in other Government organizations such as the Department of Immigration in Darwin and Canberra, the Department of Housing and Construction in Canberra and Alice Springs and finally the Department of Aboriginal Affairs in Canberra. I enjoyed the Department of Aboriginal Affairs as I was in the budgeting area and I travelled to Darwin and Alice Springs to attend meetings – my old familiar territory.

I met Bruce in Darwin and after Cyclone Tracey he transferred to Canberra as a Soil Conservationist in the Department of Capital Territory. We were married in 1975. We had a daughter and son in Canberra and after seven years moved to Brisbane. Our son Sandy was born there. From Brisbane we transferred to Rockhampton because of Bruce's work.

I commenced work at Allenstown State School in 1991 and since then have worked in many schools in Rockhampton. I can't believe that I am still working in school administration. No two five minutes are the same in a school so that is probably what has kept me going.

I have enjoyed living in Rockhampton as it was an easy place to bring up the children and they were able to complete their tertiary education at CQUniversity. Bruce's mother was born and raised on 'Gracemere Station' so through our close connection to the Archers we have been involved in many family activities at 'Gracemere' over the years.

I enjoy reading, lap swimming, pleasant sailing, ikebana and local history.

I joined Zonta three years ago and enjoy the association with ladies involved in improving the status of women. I manage the breast cushion project and from my sister's experience last year, I know they provide a great deal of comfort for women with breast cancer.

Treasurer has been unable to complete her term of office.


