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presented information on NAIDOC, and some of the local community engagement activities with indigenous women. The 2015 theme for NAIDOC week 'We all stand on Sacred Ground: Learn, Respect and Celebrate' highlights Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people's strong spiritual and cultural connection to land and sea. As part of the celebrations for NAIDOC week in Warwick, there was a bush tucker tasting at Warwick Hospital, and the Family Fun Day in the park. Kayleen has advised that Family Fun Day is to be held again in 2016, and has invited Zonta Club of Warwick to participate. We were also interested to hear of the Warwick Indigenous Network Group (WING) and Yarning Circle – a current project being undertaken is cooking classes for young indigenous girls. Kayleen is keen to have stronger community involvement, and I will continue to liaise with her and present information at forthcoming meetings.

Over the past month, I have enjoyed the fellowship of members: sharing many laughs during the Afternoon with Denise Scott, and walking with Janet and Mary around Maryvale for the Walk for a Cause event. I will forward information on the Peace Films being featured in August and September – perhaps another opportunity for fellowship.

Jenny Loy and husband Alex recently visited their eldest son Daniel in New Zealand. Here's an update on their travels.

Daniel left Aus Land at the end of February to go and do harvest in the Marlborough Wine Region which is in the north of the South Island. He had a guaranteed 6 weeks working at a large winery (St. Claire Family Winery). Once that was finished he went seeking further work and found it pruning vines at "Te Whare Ra" Winery and so he left home with a small suitcase and has not returned to Australia again.

It is a fascinating area that he is a part of. We stayed in Blenheim where he lives with the same family that took him in as a 6-week boarder when he first went there. For this reason we rented a small unit in a Motel complex so that our stay would be comfortable. Because Daniel was trying to get more permanent work where he was working he did not take time off work so each day Alex and I headed off in our hire car on an adventure to look at the countryside. In our travels we went North, South, East and West of Blenheim and also looked all around the Blenheim area. On the weekend we got the full wine tour with Daniel as well as a trip to Nelson.

The whole area directly around Blenheim is vineyards and I think in some way most of Blenheim is connected to the wine industry. The man of the home where he lives is a chef at the vineyard he went to work in originally. St. Claire Vineyard makes as much wine every year as what the whole of the Stanthorpe area makes in a year. The vineyards have sheep that graze through the grounds to keep them tidy and as well chickens to eat insects.

Apart from all of the adventures it was just so lovely to see Daniel and to now know visually where he is and what he is doing. I returned a sad mother at having to leave him but a happy mother because I can now picture him in his environment and know it is all legitimate and above board.

One photo is vines for as far as the eye can see. I found a Fromm wine and couldn't resist a photo for Jacinta and the other photo is general landscape everywhere you go. Snow capped mountains and green pastures and rugged hills.
