This is a critical piece of infrastructure to future proof the Sugar City against the impacts of devastating natural disasters.

It would deliver not only a substantially reduced damage bill from a storm surge but assist with spiralling insurance premiums by reducing the risk to homes and businesses.

An Albanese Labor Government will contribute \$5 million towards this project, with the remainder to be funded by state or local government. Mackay will be the first to receive funding from Labor's new Disaster Ready Fund, which will invest up to \$200 million per year on disaster prevention and resilience.

Thousands of Australians who

face bushfires, floods and cyclones every year deserve to be protected by a Federal Government who plans ahead and invests to keep them safe.

If matched by State, Territory or local governments, it would provide up to \$400 million annually for investment in disaster prevention and resilience - something called for by groups as broad as the Government's own Productivity Commission, insurers, local governments and disaster relief bodies.

Labor's Plan for Disaster Readiness will also:

 Continue to fully fund disaster recovery through the existing budget processes, including the national Disaster Recovery Funding Arrangements.

- Cut red tape so disaster resilience funding can get out the door
- Improve the efficiency of disaster recovery processes, to simplify and speed up payments to disaster victims and repairs to damaged infrastructure.
- Assist with spiralling insurance premiums in disaster-prone regions, by reducing the risk of expensive damage to homes and businesses.

Only an Albanese Labor Government will keep Australians safe and communities strong in the face of natural disasters. Only Labor will build a better future for disaster prone communities.
