At the same time, changes have been made to the National Employment Standards that now require workplaces to be informed about the impact DV has on the workplace and how to recognise and respond appropriately. An overview of Queensland's CEO Challenge (Inc) Workplace Programs to Prevent Domestic Violence, the only programs of their type in Australia, was presented by Jacque

(the hopeful outcome) Zonta Club of Rockhampton developed a 'before' and 'after' evaluative questionnaire that was deliberately designed to look beyond the stereotypical image of a domestic violence victim (a woman bruised through a physical attack) and to consider

the multi-gendered nature of workplaces, and workers' experiences of the diversity of peo-

Participants were asked to respond to 15 questions PRIOR to and POST the presenta-

ple within their midst, victim to or perpetrator of domestic violence.

Taka, Program Manager, CEO Challenge, with the Capricornia Police District Superintendent, Ron Van Saane, setting the scene with some sobering statistics that remain well above all other areas across the State in regard to the number of reported DV incidences. In order to identify any change in knowledge or attitude as a result of the presentations



tions. 52% of them submitted their responses. Key probes were directed towards awareness of the legislation, women victims, male victims, perpetrator knowledge and experience, and the workplace's capacity to respond to changes to the legislation. The difference between the Prior and Post responses was significant in most instances. For example, 37.5% of participants reported a significant change in their knowledge with 50% reporting some change; 67% reported having supported a woman in the workplace experi-

encing DV; 55% reported they would definitely include male victims as part of introducing workplace DV policies, and 4% already do; 21% reported having supported a perpetrator in the workplace; and, 71% reported that everyone should be accountable for responding

It would appear from the analysis of the information collected through the evaluation that workers are already aware of the experiences of both victims and perpetrators of DV in their midst and that many have supported both in their strife in one way or another. What the new legislation does is formalise this relationship, identifying another avenue of dedicated support in the struggle to turn the tide of increasing DV incidences. The CEO Challenge Workplace Programs provide a process to enable this to happen by supporting companies and organisations to develop realistic policies and procedures, and to train staff in how to appropriately 'Recognise, Respond, and Refer' colleagues affected by DV.
