Dame Carol Kadu's Early Learning Centre PNG

As you will be aware Dame Carol Kidu was the guest speaker at our International Women's Day luncheon back in March.

Our club donated some funds to assist with final completion of the early learning centre, including water tanks that will benefit the whole community.

The Centre opened in late August, and we have just received this update from Carol.

"The opening of the learning centre went very well but it has opened up a whole new spectrum of challenges to ensure that the building (which I am very pleased with) becomes a hive of learning activities. A building alone is not development, and I need to facilitate the process of transforming the building into a centre for sustainable development for the large population who have become marginalised from the formal systems.

Of course, I cannot do it alone and I am very grateful that the Kokoda Track Foundation (KTF) led by Dr Genevieve Nelson has partnered with the Centre and is funding and managing the Pari/Taurama FODE Centre for second chance education as well as the Early Learning Centre. They are doing incredibly good work providing second chance education for people in PNG.

The Learning Centre is also partnering with Kyeema Foundation to do coral gardens and mangrove rehabilitation as well as small scale village chicken projects.

It will also be a sub-centre for Ginigoada Foundation which offers community based lifelong learning and skills development opportunities for the marginalised with a focus on women and young people.

I do feel overwhelmed but as more and more good people get put in place the way forward will become clearer."

I Have attached a photos They show one of the water tanks (the second one is at the back of the building) that were provided by Whitsunday's Zonta Club. The funding plus a little extra from me covered the 2 tanks and fittings and cement slabs for installation. Our sincere thanks to everyone for this very important addition to the learning complex which people from the main village can also get their water from.

My Greek Adventure

This September/October, Barry and I had the opportunity to join a friend on his boat, on a month's cruise through the eastern islands of Greece.

The weather was kind, the sea so blue, the islands barren and rocky, and the ports and villages a treat of white washed houses, harbour side restaurants and narrow streets.

We day-sailed to 12 different ports and islands and spent a couple of days in each harbour. Enough time to explore the back streets, small shops and local restaurants. Lots of history to wonder about and white and blue mansions set on barren hillsides.

The ports are full of small traditional fishing boats, all in perfect order and proudly flying the Greek flag.

A bit of trivia – a Greek salad comprised the usual tomatoes (SOOO good), cucumber, red onion, olives, capsicum and feta, but also capers and bits of dried bread for crunch. Dressed with lots of olive oil and herbs.

Not a lot of English spoken, once one is off the tourist strip, so we had some wonderfully funny hand conversations. Try asking for mince – they don't have it on display – just done to order.
